PRESUMPTIVE DIAGNOSIS

- Seborrheic Keratosis = 07
(noncancerous (benign) wart-like growths on the surface of the skin)
- Actinic keratosis = 13
(precancerous growth on the skin)
- Basal cell carcinoma = 04
(slow-growing form of skin cancer)
- Squamous cell carcinoma = 03
(second most common type of skin cancer)
- Dysplastic nevus = 19
(mole whose appearance is different from that of common moles)
- Congenital nevus = 03
(mole that is present at or developing shortly after birth)
- Melanoma = 03
(most dangerous type of skin cancer)
- Mole/nevus = 18
(non-cancerous (benign) skin lesion)
- Other = 16
(including one cutaneous T cell carcinoma)
